



CHAPTER 69.

An Act to provide for the Payment of an Allowance to John Herbert Turner.

[6th April, 1916.]

WHEREAS the Honorable John Herbert Turner has retired Preamble
from the public service of British Columbia after many
years of service as a member of the Legislative Assembly, Prime
Minister, and Agent-General for the Province in London, England,
and it is fitting that the Legislature and the people of British
Columbia acknowledge his great public services by making the
grants hereinafter provided:

Therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of
the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia,
enacts as follows:—

1. There shall be paid to the said John Herbert Turner out of the Annuity to retiring
Agent-General
Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Province the sum of five thousand
dollars forthwith after the passing of this Act, and thereafter the
sum of five hundred dollars a month during his lifetime, the first
monthly payment to be computed from the first day of January,
1916.

2. In case the said John Herbert Turner predeceases his wife, Annuity to wife
on his decease.
Elizabeth Turner, there shall be paid to the said Elizabeth Turner
out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Province during her
lifetime the sum of two hundred and eight dollars and thirty four
cents a month, the first payment to be computed from the first day
of the month next after the date of the decease of the said John
Herbert Turner.

Free from taxes.

3. The said sums so to be paid shall be free and clear of all taxes and deductions whatsoever.
