CHAP. 16.

An Act to remove Disqualifications of Justices of the Peace
in certain cases.

[12th May, 1883.]

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the
Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia,
enacts as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Justices of the Peace Act, short title.
1883.”

2. A Justice of the Peace shall not be incapable of acting as a Justice on the trial of any offence arising under an Act to be put in force by a municipal corporation, or a local board of health, or any other local authority, by reason only of his being one of several ratepayers, or as one of any other class of persons liable, in common with the others, to contribute to or to be benefited by any fund to the account of which the penalty payable in respect of such offence is directed to be carried, or of which it will form part, or to contribute to any rate or expenses in diminution of which such penalty will go. Certain disqualifications removed.
