An Act to amend the "Centennial Celebration Act."*[Assented to 28th March, 1957.]*

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Centennial Celebration Act Amendment Act, 1957."

Re enacts s. 17.

2. Section 17 of the "Centennial Celebration Act," being chapter 56 of the Statutes of 1956, is repealed, and the following is substituted:—

"17 (1) No person shall in any way use, publish, display, or reproduce, or cause to be published, displayed, or reproduced, the emblem of the Committee, except on written authorization of the Committee.

"(2) No person shall, for the purpose of denoting either himself or a group of persons, assume, publish, use, or continue to use any name, designation, title, or device that indicates or tends to indicate, or that is reasonably susceptible of the interpretation that he or such group is connected with, or established or supported by the British Columbia Centennial Committee, or has any authority from or exercises any function of the Committee, if in fact he or it is not connected with or established or supported by the Committee, or in fact has no such authority from, or does not exercise any function of the Committee.

"(3) Any person contravening the provisions of this section is liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty of not more than one hundred dollars for each contravention."
