

CHAPTER 61.

An Act to exclude Harrison Hot Springs Property from the Municipality of Kent.

[21st February, 1895.]

WHEREAS a Petition has been presented by John R. Brown and Preamble. Jessica M. C. Brown, both of Harrison Hot Springs, and J. C. Armstrong, of the City of New Westminster, praying that the lands hereinafter described, namely, Lot 460, Group 1, New Westminster District; W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 7, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 7, S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S. W. 1 Sec. 7, all in Township 4, Range 28 West of the 6th Meridian; E. $\frac{1}{2}$ and N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 12, frational N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 13, fractional S. E. 1 and S. W. 1 Sec. 13, fractional S. E. 1 Sec. 23, Subdivision 3 of S. W. ¹/₄ Sec. 12, fractional N. E. ¹/₄ Sec. 14; part of Sec. 14; all in Township 4, Range 29 West of the 6th Meridian, should be removed and excluded from the limits of the Municipality of Kent, in the Province of British Columbia, and that the Letters Patent should be amended to carry out such purpose:

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of such petition:

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:----

1. That the lands hereinafter described, namely, Lot 460, Group 1, Exclusion of certain New Westminster District; W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 7, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of S. Sec. 14, all in Township 4, Range 29 West of the 6th Meridian, be and the same are hereby removed and excluded from the said limits of the Municipality of Kent.

2. And it is further enacted that the said Letters Patent be amended accordingly to carry out the above purpose.

3. This Act may be cited as the "Harrison Hot Springs Exclusion Act, 1895."
