An Act to Amend the Cultus Lake Park Act

[Assented to 29th March, 1962.]

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Cultus Lake Park Act Amendment Act, 1962.

Amends s 14.

- 2. Section 14 of the Cultus Lake Park Act, being chapter 63 of the Statutes of British Columbia, 1932, is amended by striking out clause (a) and substituting:—
 - "(a) grant concessions and licences 'o any person or persons for any term or terms for any purpose or purposes that the Board considers conducive to the more convenient use of the park by the public and make charges therefor; but a concession or licence shall not be granted for a term, including any option for renewal.
 - "(i) in excess of five years, except with the concurrent approval of the Councils of The City of Chilliwack and The Corporation of the Township of Chilliwhack; or
 - "(ii) in excess of twenty years in any event."

Further amends s. 14.

- 3. Section 14 is further amended by adding the following as clause (i):—
 - "(j) exercise by by-law, with the concurrent approval of the Councils of the city and township, any or all of the powers under section 871 of the Municipal Act."

Re-enacts s 15.

- 4. Section 15 is repealed and the following substituted:-
- "15. (1) The remuneration for the Chairman and the other members of the Board shall be as authorized and fixed from time to time by concurrent by-laws adopted by the Councils of the city and township, and in addition thereto the Chairman and each other member is entitled to receive his actual disbursement for expenses in visiting or superintending the park if such expenses are approved by the Board.
- "(2) The remuneration for the Chairman may be authorized and fixed at a greater amount than for the other members of the Board"
