



CHAPTER 72.

An Act to validate certain By-laws of the Municipality
of the City of Chilliwack.

[Assented to 1st April, 1931.]

WHEREAS doubts have arisen as to the validity of the debenture by-laws of the Corporation of the City of Chilliwack herein-after mentioned, for the reason that more than twenty-one days elapsed between the passage by the Council of the said by-laws and the day on which the votes of the electors on said by-laws were taken:

Preamble.

And whereas the Corporation of the City of Chilliwack has by its petition prayed that legislation be enacted to validate the said by-laws:

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition:

Therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "City of Chilliwack Debenture By-laws Validation Act."

Short title.

2. "The City of Chilliwack Public School Debenture By-law, 1927," being a by-law of the Corporation of the City of Chilliwack to raise by way of debentures the sum of fifty thousand dollars for the purpose of providing a new public school, finally reconsidered, adopted, and passed by the Council of the said municipality on the sixteenth day of January, 1928, and registered in the office of the County Court for the County of Westminster on the twenty-seventh day of January, 1928; "The City of Chilliwack Bridges Replacement Debenture By-law, 1927," being a by-law of the Corporation of the City of Chilliwack to raise by way of debentures the sum of ten thousand dollars for the purpose of the replacement jointly with the

Validation of by-laws.

Municipality of the Township of Chilliwack of Wells Street and Young Street Bridges, finally reconsidered, adopted, and passed by the Council of the said municipality on the sixteenth day of January, 1928, and registered in the office of the County Court for the County of Westminister on the twenty-seventh day of January, 1928; and "The City of Chilliwack Pole Removal Debenture By-law, 1929," being a by-law of the Corporation of the City of Chilliwack to raise by way of debentures the sum of nine thousand dollars for the purpose of the removal of electric light and telephone poles from a portion of the city streets, finally reconsidered, adopted, and passed by the Council of the said municipality on the twentieth day of January, 1930, and registered in the office of the County Court for the County of Westminister on the twenty-seventh day of January, 1930, shall be deemed to have properly received the assent of the electors of the municipality as required by the "Municipal Act," and to be good and valid by-laws of the Corporation of the City of Chilliwack, and to have taken effect and come into force and been binding on the Corporation of the City of Chilliwack as and from the respective dates of registration thereof.
