



CHAPTER 84.

An Act authorizing The Corporation of the City of Kamloops to convey certain Lands to the Crown.

[Assented to 30th March, 1950.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS by the "Kamloops Public Park Act, 1911," being chapter 28 of the Statutes of 1911, it was declared to be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to grant, upon such conditions as he shall think fit, to The Corporation of the City of Kamloops (hereinafter called "the Corporation") all and singular those certain pieces and parcels of land hereinafter more particularly described, such land to be used for the recreation and enjoyment of the public as public parks and for use by the Corporation for municipal purposes:

And whereas pursuant to the said Act a conveyance of the said land was granted to the Corporation:

And whereas the Corporation is now desirous, in consideration of payment to it of seven thousand dollars, of reconveying the said land to the Crown in the right of the Province, and whereas the Crown is desirous of reacquiring the said land:

Therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the "Kamloops Enabling Act."

Release from obligations imposed by 1911 Act.

2. The Corporation, upon the granting of the conveyance mentioned in section 3, is released from any obligations imposed upon it by the "Kamloops Public Park Act, 1911."

Power to Corporation to convey lands.

3. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of the "Municipal Act," the Corporation is authorized, without the assent of the electors, to convey to the Crown in the right of the Province of

British Columbia, in consideration of the payment to the Corporation of the sum of seven thousand dollars, all and singular those certain pieces and parcels of land being Lots 7, 8, and 9, Block 1, of part of District Lots 232, 233, and 234, Group 1, Map 193, of Kamloops Division of Yale District.

Power to Crown to
pay purchase price.

4. The Crown in the right of the Province is authorized to pay to the Corporation the sum of seven thousand dollars as the purchase price of the land described in section 3.
