



CHAPTER 62.

An Act respecting the Brunette Saw Mill Company, Limited Liability.

[8th April, 1905.]

WHEREAS the Brunette Saw Mill Company, Limited Liability, Preamble.
hereinafter called "the Company," (a company whose incorporation was ratified and confirmed by 57 Victoria, chapter 54) has by its petition prayed that its existence be extended for a period of fifty years from the 7th day of February, 1906.

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition:

Therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:—

1. The period of the corporate existence of the Company shall be and the same is hereby extended for fifty (50) years from and after the 7th day of February, A.D. 1906, and up to and including the 7th day of February, A.D. 1956, and the Company shall have during such term of fifty (50) years the same rights, powers and privileges as it now has, and shall be subject to the same conditions as it now is. Corporate existence of Company extended to 1956.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Brunette Saw Mill Company, Short title.
Limited Liability, Extension Act, 1905."
