CHAPTER 76

An Act to Adjust Dyking Assessments

[Assented to 29th March, 1962.]

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Dyking Assessments Adjustment Act, 1962.

Pitt Meadows Dyking District No. 1 2. The indebtedness of the Pitt Meadows Dyking District No. 1 to the Province under the *Dyking Assessments Adjustment Act*, 1947, which now amounts to the sum of thirteen thousand nine hundred and sixty-one dollars and seventeen cents, is remitted, and the several memoranda and assessment rolls filed in the Land Registry Office by the Inspector of Dykes in respect of charges placed upon the lands in that district pursuant to that indebtedness are cancelled.

Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2.

- 3. The indebtedness of Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2 to the Province shall be deemed to have been incurred by Maple Ridge Dyking District, and the Maple Ridge Dyking District is indebted to the Province accordingly, and upon the coming into force of the Dyking Assessments Adjustment Act. 1962,
 - (a) the Inspector of Dykes shall
 - (i) cause to be transferred to an account in the name of Maple Ridge Dyking District all money standing to the credit of Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2 in any bank;
 - (ii) transfer to the accounts of Maple Ridge Dyking District
 - (A) all accounts receivable of Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2;
 - (B) all assessments receivable of Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2; and
 - (c) all accounts payable of Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2;
 - (b) every amount owing to Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2 as a result of charges imposed upon lands in the district by Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2 shall be deemed to be owing to and are payable to Maple Ridge Dyking District, and the receipt therefor of the Maple Ridge Dyking District is a good and sufficient discharge to the person who pays such an amount to the extent of the payment made;
 - (c) every other amount owing to Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2 shall be deemed to be owing to and is payable to Maple

- Ridge Dyking District, and the receipt therefor of the Maple Ridge Dyking District is a good and sufficient discharge to the person who pays such an amount to the extent of the payment made;
- (d) every amount owing by Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2 shall be deemed to be owing by Maple Ridge Dyking District and no longer owing by Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2, and payment thereof by Maple Ridge Dyking District constitutes a good and sufficient discharge of the liability; and
- (e) the Renewal Reserve Account of the Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2 is transferred to and shall be deemed to be an account standing to the credit of Maple Ridge Dyking District, and the Inspector of Dykes shall make all necessary arrangements in order that the bank records in connection therewith shall be suitably altered.

Matsqui Drainage District No. 1.

- 4. The indebtedness of Matsqui Drainage District No. 1 to the Province shall be deemed to have been incurred by Matsqui Dyking District, and the Matsqui Dyking District is indebted to the Province accordingly, and upon the coming into force of the Dyking Assessments Adjustment Act, 1962.
 - (a) the Inspector of Dykes shall
 - (i) cause to be transferred to an account in the name of Matsqui Dyking District all money standing to the credit of Matsqui Drainage District No. 1 in any bank;
 - (ii) transfer to the accounts of Matsqui Dyking District
 - (A) all accounts receivable of Matsqui Drainage District No. 1;
 - (P) all assessments receivable of Matsqui Drainage District No. 1; and
 - (c) all accounts payable of Maple Ridge Drainage Dis-No. 1;
 - (b) every amount owing to Matsqui Drainage District No. 1 as a result of charges imposed upon lands in the district by Matsqui Drainage District No. 1 shall be deemed to be owing to and are payable to Matsqui Dyking District, and the receipt therefor of the Matsqui Dyking District is a good and sufficient discharge to the person who pays such an amount to the extent of the payment made;
 - (c) every other amount owing to Matsqui Drainage District No. 1 shall be deemed to be owing to and is payable to Matsqui Dyking District, and the receipt therefor of the Matsqui Dyking District is a good and sufficient discharge to the person who pays such an amount to the extent of the payment made;
 - (d) every amount owing by Matsqui Drainage District No. 1 shall be deemed to be owing by Matsqui Dyking District and no

- longer owing by Matsqui Drainage District No. 1, and payment thereof by Matsqui Dyking District constitutes a good and sufficient discharge of the liability; and
- (e) the Renewal Reserve Account of the Matsqui Drainage District No. 1 is transferred to and shall be deemed to be an account standing to the credit of Matsqui Dyking District, and the Inspector of Dykes shall make all necessary arrangements in order that the bank records in connection therewith shall be suitably altered.

Dissolution.

- 5. The Pitt Meadows Dyking District No. 1, the Maple Ridge Drainage District No. 2, and the Matsqui Drainage District No. 1 are dissolved.
- Amends c. 26 of 1947.
- 6. The Dyking Assessments Adjustment Act, 1947, being chapter 26 of the Statutes of 1947, as amended by chapter 15 of the Statutes of 1961, is amended as follows:—
 - (a) By striking out section 21 and substituting:—
- "21. The payments to the Minister of Finance of the sums established as payments on account of capital indebtedness pursuant to section 6 and as listed in column 3 of the Schedule shall be deemed to have been deferred for the year 1961 and for the year 1962."
 - (b) By striking out the Schedule and sub-tituting:-
