1955, c. 99.An Act to Amend the City of Greenwood
Debt Refunding Act, 1941-42

[Assented to 27th March, 1963.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS clause (d) of subsection (1) of section 16 of the *City of Greenwood Debt Refunding Act, 1941-42*, being chapter 13 of the Statutes of 1941-42, provides that until the refunding debentures are fully paid the City shall not pay any salary or remuneration to any member of the Board of School Trustees or to any member of the Board of Police Commissioners:

And whereas clause (e) of subsection (1) of section 16 of the *City of Greenwood Debt Refunding Act, 1941-42*, as amended by the *City of Greenwood Debt Refunding Act, 1941-42, Amendment Act, 1955*, being chapter 99 of the Statutes of 1955, provides that the City may, by by-law, provide for the payment to each member of the Council, including the Mayor, remuneration up to a maximum of three hundred dollars per annum, and that the by-law may further provide that a portion of the said remuneration shall be paid as an allowance for expenses incident to the discharge of the duties of office:

And whereas the City has made due provision for the full payment of the refunding debentures and the interest thereon:

And whereas the above-mentioned provisions of the Act provide limitations with regard to members of the Board of School Trustees, of the Board of Police Commissioners, and of the Council that do not apply to such members in other municipalities:

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:—

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the *City of Greenwood Debt Refunding Act, 1941-42, Amendment Act, 1963*.

Amends s. 16.

2. Section 16 of the *City of Greenwood Debt Refunding Act, 1941-42*, being chapter 13 of the Statutes of 1941-42, is amended by striking out clauses (d) and (e).

Date of effect

3. This Act shall be deemed to have come into force and effect on the thirty-first day of December, 1962, and is retroactive to the extent necessary to give full force and effect to the provisions thereof on and after that date.
