



## CHAPTER 69.

**An Act to enable the Greater Nanaimo Water District  
to plan Sewerage and Drainage Systems.**

[Assented to 20th March, 1958.]

**H**ER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the  
Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts  
as follows:—

Short title.

**1.** This Act may be cited as the “Greater Nanaimo Sewerage and  
Drainage Enabling Act.”

Allows water district  
to plan sewerage  
systems.

**2.** Notwithstanding the provisions of the “Greater Nanaimo Water  
District Act,” the Greater Nanaimo Water District, incorporated by the  
“Greater Nanaimo Water District Act,” may prepare, or cause to be  
prepared, a plan or plans for a system or systems of sewerage or drainage  
works, or both sewerage and drainage works, to serve the territory within  
and in the vicinity of The Corporation of the City of Nanaimo and the  
Harewood Improvement District.

Apportionment  
of costs.

**3.** No plan shall be prepared under section 2 without the written  
authority of The Corporation of the City of Nanaimo and the Harewood  
Improvement District. Such authority shall set out the nature and  
extent of such planning and the apportionment or method of apportion-  
ment of the cost involved and shall name the firm or person to be  
engaged to undertake the work.

Authority to borrow.

**4.** The Greater Nanaimo Water District may borrow from time to  
time such sums as may be necessary for the purposes of this Act upon  
the security of any or all accounts due or to become due under section 5  
hereof.

Repayment of  
borrowings.

**5.** The Corporation of the City of Nanaimo and the Harewood  
Improvement District shall be liable to the extent of their respective

shares of the cost involved and shall reimburse the Greater Nanaimo Water District for all expenditures made in pursuance of the provisions of this Act forthwith upon receipt of a statement of the amount so expended, certified by the Treasurer of the Greater Nanaimo Water District.

Retroactive effect.

6. This Act comes into force and effect on the first day of January, 1958, and is retroactive to the extent necessary to give effect to the provisions thereof.
